Commissioner's Notes

Will Vick Commissioner Lone Star Region, USA Volleyball



COMMISSIONER'S NOTES

Our Lone Star Regional Championships have finished and plans are now underway for the 2020 Season. The Adult Regional Championships were hosted by Thang Nguyen, Adult Tournament Director. Katy Volleyball Academy again provided their Faith West facility for the event. The Junior Regional Championships, hosted by Tournaments Inc. and Austin Juniors, were played on two separate weekends at the George R. Brown Convention Center in Houston. The Girls 18 Regional Championships, held earlier in the season, was hosted by Austin Juniors and held at the Round Rock Sports Center and ASC Cedar Park. A great job was done by all hardworking members who were responsible for hosting each of these Regional events.

For the remainder of the 2019 Indoor Season, we have our Girls' and Boys' Junior National Championships to still take place. The 2019 Girls' Junior National Championships in Indianapolis, Indiana, is scheduled for June 27th through July 6th. The 2019 Boys' Junior National Championships will be in Dallas, Texas, on June 30 through July 7th. According to the large number of teams we had qualify this season, we should be well represented at both events.

Our overall membership has continued to grow for the 2019 Season. We ended the 2018 Season with a total of 20,124 registered members. As of May 31st, our records reflect a total of 20,633 paid members and we will continue to register a number of Outdoor players before the end of the Season. We currently have 39 members still listed on the **UNPAID List** in the Region database. These are members who have registered on-line but have not yet paid their individual registration fees for the 2019 Season. Most of these individuals are players but we also have a few officials and coaches on the list. Registrations are not completed until all fees have been paid. Unpaid members need to go online to add their credit card or have their club mail the registration fees into the Region Office. These records must be cleared before we can start registrations for the 2020 Season. Hopefully, registered members who actually participated in sanctioned tournaments or practices will have their fees updated. **Club directors, you will have until the end July to get these "unpaid" members straightened out as we will start deleting applications from the system as soon as all our competitions have been completed for this season. I'm sure members will be interested to know that they were not actually registered when they had been participating in sanctioned events.**

Registrations for the 2020 Season will begin on September 1st and will need to be completed through the USA Volleyball's online Member Management System (MMS). For the 2020 season, USAV is moving their MMS to a new company, SportsEngine, and sign-in procedures will be different from previous seasons. The Region Registrar, Karen Tarmon, will be sending more information regarding the new MMS as it becomes available. She can be contacted at LSRregistrar@gmail.com or reached at (830) 358-7714.

Should new or renewing members register for Indoor play prior to September 1st, they will be registering for only the remainder of the 2019 Season and said membership will expire on October 31st, 2019. With the limited number of remaining opportunities to play Indoor events, I would think that the majority of our new registrations prior to September 1st will be for the Outdoor events.

As you prepare for the 2020 Season, you need to remember that the Region does not sanction any Junior Indoor events after the conclusions of the Indoor season, and prior to the last day of the State High School Playoffs. For tryouts, camps, or clinics during the summer, the event hosts will be on their own for their insurance.

Club directors, parents, and players should also be aware that those members who try out for a club will not be obligated to that club until they have actually participated with the club in a sanctioned tournament. Once the player has played for their club in a sanctioned tournament, they will be expected to remain with that club for the remainder of the season. Parents should also be aware that the Region does not get involved in the financial arrangements between a clubs and its members.

Our Annual Board of Directors Meeting was held in Houston on March 29th. A copy of our Board Minutes is being published in this issue of the Newsletter. The Meeting was held on the Friday night prior to the Adult Regional Championships. Please take the opportunity to read through these minutes since any changes addressed will be those which affect us during the 2020 Season.

CALL TO ORDER: The Commissioner, Will Vick, called the meeting to order at 8:20 PM.

ROLL CALL: Absent but excused were Debbie Trainor and Crystal Lyne.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Two items were added by Thang Nguyen. The agenda was approved. (Virgie Mallett moved/ Wally Simpson seconded).

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The 2018 BOD minutes were approved as written. (Marc Holmquist moved/ Mark Papich seconded).

DATE AND LOCATION OF 2020 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING: Based on policy defined by the BOD, the 2020 Meeting will be held in conjunction with the LSR Adult Regional Championship tournament. (Virgie Mallet moved/ Thang Nguyen seconded). Adult Regionals will remain at Faith West Academy. Location for the Board Meeting will remain at Hilton Garden Inn, Houston - Energy Corridor. The specific date of the meeting will be determined at the scheduling of the LSR Adult Regional Championship tournament.

ELECTIONS: Commissioner Vick called for nominations from the floor for the positions currently up for election. All non-opposed positions were accepted by acclamation. (Mark Papich moved/ Steve Boucher seconded).

Michael Inlow, Legal Advisor for the Region resigned, and Elbert Ortiz was nominated as a replacement. Karen Tarmon read Elbert's resume. The board voted and approved Elbert Ortiz as the new legal advisor for the Lone Star Volleyball Region. Results were accepted. (Virgie Mallett moved / Steve Boucher seconded)

DIRECTOR'S REPORTS

REFERE'S CHAIR: Thomas Hoy reported that the 2018-2019 volleyball season has been very active with clinics, ratings, and tournaments. The region has certified a new record number of referees by 3/22/2019, and three mini camps for new referees in Austin, Houston, and San Antonio were conducted. The LSR currently has 41 National, 34 Junior National, 138 Regional, 1,332 Provisional, 125 Junior, 120 Junior R2 referees, and 337 Adult R2 referees. Dr. Hoy reported that the Region is recommending four Junior National Referee Candidates and two National Referees. The Region continues our mission to foster training for referees to support amateur volleyball competition.

NEW MEMBER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM: Karen Tarmon - Our member management system is going to move from Webpoint over to SportsEngine. Although there is a learning curve, Karen only sees improvement with this system.

<u>SAFESPORT REQUIREMENTS FOR 2020</u>: Karen Tarmon - The US Center for SafeSport has stated there will now be a 30 minute "refresher" course required each season. Whether the Core Training is taken once and then a refresher courses are taken; or Core Training is taken every two seasons with a refresher course in between has yet to be clarified by the Center.

<u>FINANCIAL REPORT</u>: The report was distributed to each Board member. Any questions concerning the report must be submitted in writing to the Commissioner or Treasurer.

REGISTRATIONS: Commissioner Vick reported that the Region's registered membership has had an overall increase in individual and team registrations. We closed the 2017-2018 Season with 20,115 individuals, and 1,610 teams. As of March 23, 2019, we have registered 20,409 individuals and 1,644 teams.

SCORER CHAIR REPORT: Steve Crane reported that there were 3,812 completed scorers with more attempting to complete as of the meeting day. Scorer clinics were held in 47 different cities. He reported that the Region currently has certified two International Scorers, six qualified International Scorers, 23 National Scorers, 13 Regional Scorers, 128 Provisional Scorers, and 3,640 Junior Olympic Scorers, as of March 27, 2019. He also reported that there has been a vast improvement on the number of certifications, with the score sheets now being electronically submitted. Congratulations to our two new National Scorers, Mark Begnoche and Joe Lizama.

TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR: Thang Nguyen reported that the fall Friendship tournaments did well, and helped with the number of teams in the 2018/2019 Adult Regional Tournament. This year Adult Regionals had 4 women's teams and 4 men's teams. Thang continues to research ways to get more adults involved in the Adult Programs. Currently we have five adult teams scheduled to participate in the 2019 USA Volleyball Open Championships, in Columbus, Ohio.

<u>JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT</u>: Dick Kappel reported that the number of junior teams (girls) increased. The Lone Star High Performance teams from 2018 finished well placing 2nd, 7th, and 8th in the USA HP Tournament. The Region will continue to support High Performance Program with three girls' teams and raise the number of boys' teams from one to two.

<u>AUSTIN AREA REPRESENTATIVE:</u> Virgie Mallet reported that beach volleyball continues to grow and grow. Indoor is steadily growing.

<u>SAN ANTONIO AREA REPRESENTATIVE</u>: Mar Resendiz reported that everything is still growing, and is hearing about a lot of growth and interest in the Rio Grande Valley area.

<u>BEAUMONT AREA REPRESENTATIVE:</u> Steve Boucher stated that growth is steady, and they are continuing to get referees certified throughout the area. This year they have 75 scorekeepers and 4 referees.

BRAZOS VALLEY AREA REPRESENTATIVE: Wally Simpson reported that the Brazos Valley Area continues to grow and is doing well. A lot of interest in the younger age groups.

HOUSTON AREA REPRESENTATIVE: Gordon Morrison reports that there is a lot of interested in the younger age groups, and the overall the Houston area continues to grow.

BUSINESS:

<u>USA VOLLEYBALL HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM:</u> The Region will continue to pay the entry fees for a maximum of three Junior Girls going to the Junior Girls High Performance Tournament. A motion was made to raise the number of Junior Boys High Performance Teams from one to two, for the 2019 Season by Dick Kappel. Thang Nguyen seconded the motion. The motion was carried and approved.

TOURNAMENT ENTRY FEES – 2019/2020 SEASON: Tournament entry fees will remain at \$115 for "non-paid" official events and \$175 for the first day and \$160 for second / third day for "paid" official events.

TOURNAMENT ENTRY FEES 2019/2020 SEASON (GATE FEE REVIEW): All spectator fees, excluding convention centers, will remain set at a maximum entry fee of \$5 per day for adults and \$3 per day for children 12 and under. Single day fee/passes must be available for multi-day events. All rostered team members are exempt from these fees (this includes players, coaches, chaperones, trainers, and any other club staff members listed).

REFEREE/SCORER REQUIREMENTS: Identification of team referee and scorer, on Webpoint team rosters, will again be required prior to acceptance of a Lone Star Region tournament entry for an LSR sanctioned event.

GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF BEACH PROGRAMS: Will Vick reported that the Region will develop sand courts in the Houston, San Antonio, and Austin areas for continued promotion of Beach Programs in the Lone Star Region. The Region is potentially looking for a High Performance Junior Beach Development Director. More information will be posted at a later time.

SAN ANTONIO FORCE YOUTUBE VIDEO: Board members watched and discussed the concerns of San Antonio Force. A motion to move tournament schedule entries to a month early was carried and passed. (Thang Nguyen moved/ Marc Holmquist seconded)

<u>ADJOURNMENT:</u> There being no further business, a motion was made, seconded and approved to adjourn. The time was 11:47 P.M. (Steve Crane moved/ Hal Naumann seconded)

For all of us in the Lone Star Region, we would like to 1) thank all the regional and higher certified referees that spent time rating our coaches and players, 2) thank our national-level referees that prepared the teams to officiate through our clinics held from October through April this season (over 183 clinics in 47 cities), and also 3) thank our members who went through this referee process to understand the rules and to make the game fair. We could not have done this without the help of the clubs and tournament directors. Special thanks go to the tournament directors, club directors, and coaches who completed regional referee certification this season so they could help their members get the needed ratings for junior and provisional referee certification. I want to also point out that it is not too late to complete certification this season so if you holding onto ratings or exams, just send me a picture or attachment so we can add you to the list of certified referees (thoy@satx.rr.com). Please remember that if you are still listed as "inprogress" on WebPoint (USAV database) then you probably still need ratings. If so, then go to www.lsvolleyball.org, then use the "Officials Clinics & Info" tab, and then click on the "ATTENTION In-Progress Referees" box for a listing of the four tournaments where we still have raters assigned for R2 ratings. Be mindful that all ratings must be turned in by October 1, 2019. We have rated at over 205 tournaments, over 25 scrimmages, and at four rating clinics this season. Thanks again to the tournament and club directors who scheduled and made this possible.

A heads up for next season, if you were certified this season you can attend any referee clinic next season (2019-2020) free of charge--since you hold a two-season certification. Just sign in 'pre-paid' at the clinic. There will be changes next season because we will have a new two-season rule book (2019-2021). Have a great post-season!

Glen Lietzke 2018 American Volleyball Coaches Association Hall of Fame

"Glen Lietzke has been a visionary in the volleyball coaching world, always dreaming about what more he and others could be doing to improve the sport. His list of accolades is numerous, but pale in comparison to the countless players he's had a positive influence on over his 35-year coaching career.

After brief stints at Hopkins Eisenhower High School, the University of Wisconsin at River Falls, and Southwest Missouri State, he began the next phase of his coaching career that put him on the hall of fame path. In 1984, he founded and is the current Director and President of the Austin Juniors Volleyball Board of Directors. That same year, he became an assistant coach at the University of Texas, where he went on to win 12 conference titles and the NCAA Championship in his 18-year stint with the Longhorns.

With Austin Juniors, Lietzke was crowned a USA Junior National Champion twice in 2007 and 2011 as the 17 Open Head Coach. His club offers girls and boys indoor as well as beach, with college commitments and alumni spanning the nation. For his incredible contributions, he received USA Volleyball's George J. Fisher Leader in Volleyball Award in 1998.

"It's obvious when watching Glen coach his teams that he is deeply respected and sincerely loved by his players, and completely immersed in every facet of the match," said Texas A&M Head Coach Laurie Corbelli. "Glen has mentored hundreds of coaches, players, and administrators in volleyball, and I can't think of another United States Club Director
