Roster Capt (*)



L/U: by Positions \checkmark

Warm-up: 2-4-4



Roster Capt (C)

Addition, Pt--opponents 🗸

L/U: by Serve Order \checkmark

Warm-up: 5-5-2, or so **✓**

NCAA: No Rosters

L/U-Positions W/U 4-4-5-5

Time Out Protocols

NFHS or USAV or NCAA?







Alert at 15 seconds or not?

NFHS/NCAA



USAV: End Line

(mid-point)

NFHS/NCAA: Side Line

(at attack line on R1 side)

Time Out – USAV: 30 secs, point to bench, no signal after TO

NFHS: 60 secs, point to court, signal after TO

NCAA: 60-90 secs, point to court, signal after TO

USAV – closed hands

- Subs Both Teams: USAV -repeat whistle/signal -each side
- How many allowed: 12 or 15 or 18? usav 12

USAV Protocols, Rules & Techniques

- Coaches/Staff standing: Head Coach and one Assistant
- Players standing: In warm-up area and off court
- Incomplete Team: Must always have six players to play
- R2 Transitioning: Move to fault side to signal as allowed
- Intervals: Time between sets starts at "end of set" signal
- Net Contact: Fault, during action of play











More USAV Rules/Protocols

Center Line: Fault, only if there is interference or safety issue







All Legal

3rd & 4th contact by same player:

USAV -



Ball under the net: Line Violation (Point with finger to mid-point of centerline)

Coach and players may now sit in any chair on team
 bench, and coach can be in warmup area.



Libero/Team Uniforms





Solid color or Contrasting?

USAV – Libero and Team jerseys only need to be contrasting. Solid color jerseys are ok too, as in past seasons.

Libero(s) on USAV Team

Allowed on Roster: 2

How many can serve: 2

But only serve in one position









USAV Protests



How long to file a protest? Until next serve or 1 minute after end of set/match

How are they filed?

USAV: Captain, or Coach for 14 and under teams thru R2 How Administered? R1 accepts if not judgment, then suspends play, requests head referee or court manager to court by sending a responsible person, stay on court until they arrive, head referee/court manager makes final ruling

Consequences?

USAV: Upheld or Reversed













NFHS Subs, Time Outs and Change Courts












More Mechanics & Techniques

Illegal Back Row Block/Screening:



Arms Fully Extended

Hands At Head Height





Mechanics cont'd.

E

Serve USAV/NFHS: 5-sec= if USAV 14 & under (and ball cleaning falls), or NFHS (and they can catch the ball)

Serve USAV/NCAA: 8-sec if USAV 15+ or NCAA (No Re-serve)

Re-serve/USAV - One per completed rally for 14 and under

NFHS – One per term of service

NCAA/USAV 15 and over – None

Player in net: USAV - Open Hand Gesture, No #

NCAA/NFHS – Signal, Give #

Intermission: USAV – No intermission

NCAA/NFHS – Yes, if notified in advance





Mechanics USAV vs. NFHS



USAV

USA Vollevball.

Solid Centerline- required Red/Yellow Cards – R1 only Splints/braces on hands/arms -ok if padded and no advantage Player equipment falls to floor -Replay and Team Delay 3rd Time Out Request –IR or TDW Exceptional sub —out for match Penetrating hand over the net to bring ball back- no

NFHS

Solid or shadow-bordered R1/R2, R2 signals with cards Splints/braces on hand/arm -not allowed Player equipment on floor -Replay only 3rd Time Out Request –TDW Exceptional sub —out for set Penetrating above net to bring ball back- yes

Mechanics USAV vs. NFHS



<u>USAV</u> <u>NFHS</u>

Illegal sub request – IR, if not whistled Illegal sub request - TDW

Contact with the net and cables outside of the antennae:

-no fault unless disruptive

R2 'ready' signal- both hands up

-yes, net fault

R2 'ready' signal- one arm

Team & Individual Sanctions

Team: (USAV) Match, (NFHS/NCAA) Set

Individual: (USAV/NFHS) Match, (NCAA) Set

Expulsion: (USAV only) Set

Disqualification:

(USAV) Match / No Loss of Point (NCAA) Match / Loss of Point (NFHS) Match / Loss of Point





Illegal Player

- Points Removed (USAV): All points from the time illegal player was in current position.
- Points Removed (NCAA/NFHS): All points since opponents last serve.

Headgear

- USAV Helmets are allowed if they do not create a safety issue for player or teammates
- NCAA/NFHS Require waiver from organization for helmets to be used
- Religious head coverings require an official waiver signed by the Rules Interpreter or organization (USAV, NCAA, NFHS)





Roster Changes / Consequences

Lone Star Region and NCAA – do not use rosters

USAV: Roster Change by Tournament Director only at National Events

NFHS: Error or Correction = Point to Opponent

NCAA: No Roster Used

Artificial Noisemakers

NFHS/NCAA – Not allowed
USAV – Not prohibited, but Event Manager
can disallow at tournament




